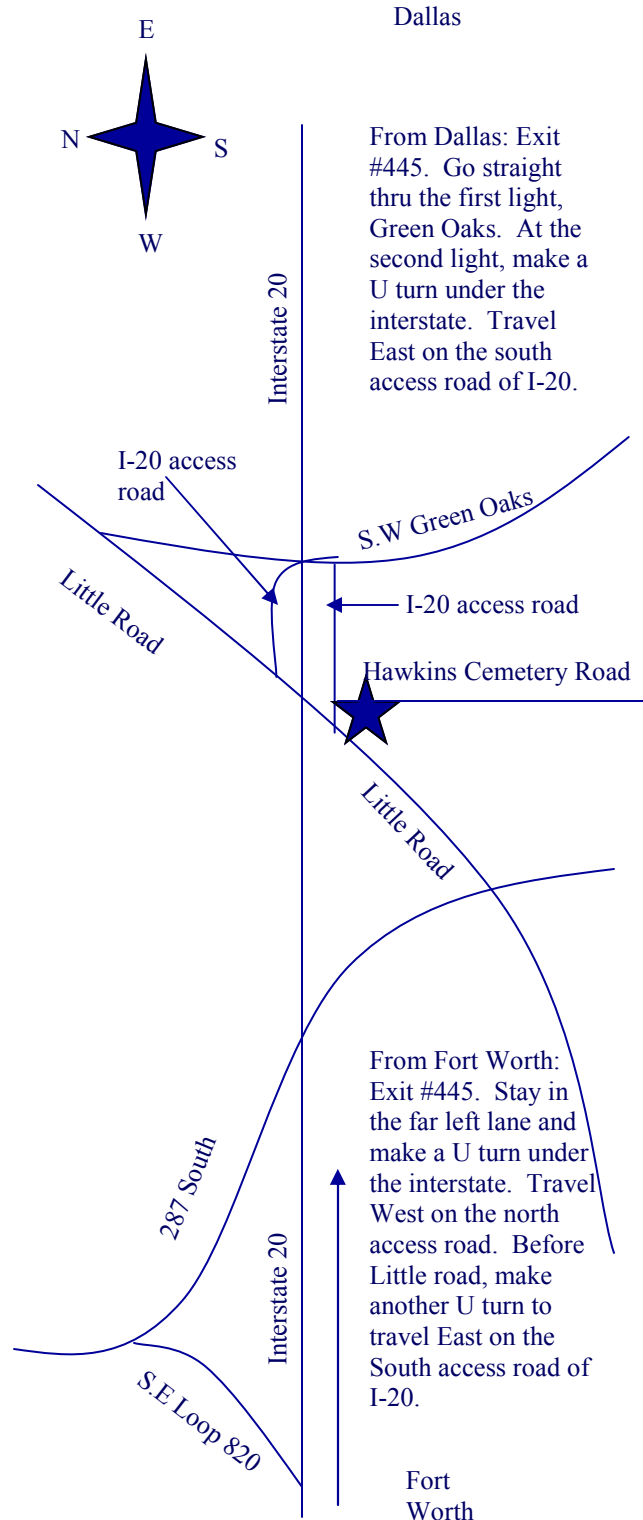

This brochure will help familiarize you with the policies of our office and provide answers to frequently asked questions.

If you find it necessary to cancel your appointment, please let us know as soon as possible.

Please bring all of your pet's medication, especially eye medications to the initial examination.

SERVICES:

ANIMAL EYE CLINIC is a specialty referral practice limited to veterinary ophthalmology. The clinic is equipped to provide a full range of veterinary ophthalmic diagnostics, therapeutics, and surgical services including plastic and reconstruction surgery, parotid duct transposition, corneal repair, glaucoma procedures, intraocular prosthesis, electroretinography, high resolution ocular ultrasound, and phacoemulsification for cataract extraction.

BREED CERTIFICATION:

Examination of purebred dogs and cats for inherited ocular disease includes slit lamp biomicroscopy, direct and indirect ophthalmoscopy, and special techniques as required.

LARGE ANIMAL EXAMINATION:

The ANIMAL EYE CLINIC extends diagnostic and surgical services for horses.

SPECIALTY PRACTICE POLICY:

The ANIMAL EYE CLINIC does not offer any ancillary health care services and will examine, diagnose and treat only diseases of the eye and visual apparatus. A specialty practice is designed to be an extension of the services offered by your veterinarian.

APPOINTMENTS:

Office hours are as follows: Monday-Thursday 8:30am-5pm and Friday 9:00am-3:00 pm. Patients are seen by appointment only. Emergency services are available outside of normal business hours when required.

FEES:

Fees are payable when services are rendered. Payment may be made with cash, electronic check, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover, Debit/Check card, or Care Credit. A written estimate of fees will be provided for all patients requiring hospitalization, extensive treatment or surgery.

REFERRING VETERINARIAN:

A complete written report is sent by facsimile to your regular veterinarian after your pet's examination. Please remember to provide his/her name, and clinic name so the report is received by your doctor. Remember, your doctor will administer your pet's primary health care, and an accurate medical record is essential to quality care. Referring a difficult ophthalmic case demonstrates your veterinarian's concern for you and your pet.

OUR DOCTOR'S BACKGROUND:

Dr. Paulsen grew up in San Angelo, Texas and entered undergraduate studies at Texas A&M in 1972. He received his DVM from the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M in August 1977 and immediately entered active duty in the US Army to fulfill service obligations from his Health Professions Scholarship. From 1984 to 1987, he attended graduate school and completed an ophthalmology residency at the Colorado State University-Veterinary Teaching Hospital. In 1987 Dr. Paulsen received a Master of Science degree in Clinical Sciences and was board certified by the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists. From 1990 to the present Dr. Paulsen has maintained a referral ophthalmology practice in Arlington, Texas. From 1990 to 2002 he also maintained a consulting practice in the state of Hawaii.
